Parking Ordinance Violation Appeal Form

Before appealing your ticket, bear in mind the following points:

Finding a legal parking space nearest your place of work or point of business is every driver's responsibility. The Town's parking ordinance applies all year long, in all weather, days, nights and weekends.

Examples of appeals that are seldom granted:

Lack of knowledge of the town's parking ordinance and/or state laws

Lost ticket or forgetfulness (if the ticket was issued 30 days or more prior to appeal, it will not be considered)

Parking only for a short period

"Someone else was parked there so I thought it was a legal space"

Inability to find a legal parking space/"did not see a sign"

Unloading/loading your vehicle

* Appeals must be filed within fourteen (14) days of the date on the ticket.
