#### **ITEM 5:** To Adopt a Resolution in Support of Recycling Reform for Maine

Richard Davis explained the purpose of this Resolution. LD 2104, An Act To Support and Increase the Recycling of Packaging applies a systems-based solution called Extended-Producer Responsibility (EPR) for packaging that is used across the world. Under the EPR program, manufacturers share the responsibility of helping pay the costs of recycling and disposal of packaging waste. Producers that choose to let municipalities manage their packaging waste for them would join a Producer Responsibility Organization (PRO). The PRO collects fees from producers and distributes reimbursement payments to municipalities.

Stephan Bunker moved to take no action at this time on the proposed Resolution in Support of Recycling Reform for Maine because of the unknown effects of LD 2104; Matthew Smith seconded.
