Fire Chief Timothy D. Hardy provided a memo to the Board dated October 20, 2022. The Fire Department solicited bids for the replacement of Engine 2; Allegiance Fire &

Rescue of Walpole, Massachusetts, was the lone bidder. The cost for one (1) Pierce Enforcer 1500gpm PUC Pumper is \$861,450 with an option of a 100% prepayment discount of \$30,000. Chief Hardy reports that the bid meets all specifications that the department requested. The unit has similar features and components to Engine 1, which will help standardize the unit's training, maintenance, and operations. Allegiance Fire & Rescue also offers a full-service facility in Auburn, Maine. Chief Hardy recommended that if the funding is approved at tonight's Special Town Meeting, the Town award the bid to Allegiance Fire & Rescue.

Joshua Bell moved to award the bid for the replacement of Engine 2 to Allegiance Fire & Rescue of Walpole, Massachusetts, for one (1) Pierce Enforcer 1500gpm PUC Pumper for the price of \$861,405, contingent on approval at the Town Meeting; Scott Landry seconded.

ITEM 4: To approve an Expenditure of \$39,900 from the Public Works Municipal Landfill Equipment reserve account (SX-7987) to purchase a used Case 580 Backhoe from Beauregard Equipment for the transfer station.

Public Works Director Phil Hutchins provided photographs of the existing 19992 Cat 416 loader backhoe with 11,000 hours. He wants to purchase a 2009 Case 580 loader backhoe with 6,862 from Beauregard Equipment Sales for \$39,900. Mr. Hutchins reported the current balance in the Municipal Landfill Equipment Reserve Account as \$68,84374. If the Board approves the purchase, the new balance will be \$28,943.74. Mr. Hutchins reported that Town Mechanic Jeff Fitch inspected the backhoe and recommended the purchase. Joshua Bell inquired about using the Public Works JCB backhoe at the landfill. Mr. Hutchins stated that the JCB backhoe is too big; it would not fit in the garage. The JCB works well for Public Works ditching needs.

Scott Landry moved to approve an Expenditure of \$39,900 from the Public Works Municipal Landfill Equipment reserve account (SX-7987) to purchase a used Case 580 Backhoe from Beauregard Equipment for the transfer station; Joshua Bell seconded.
